**DAY OF THE DEAD FESTIVAL, Friday, Nov. 1<sup>st</sup>, 5-9pm:** A participatory event, the LASC's festival invites children and adults to work with artists to decorate traditional sugar skulls, create papel picado (cut paper) streamers, and design large scale sand murals. Traditional Mexican musicians and dancers will perform and at dusk, will lead participants in a beautiful candlelight parade from the LASC to the Old Episcopal Burying Ground at 3rd Street and Elm Tree Lane. In the cemetery, participants may view an exciting exhibition and talk with artists and community members who have created both traditional altars as they would be presented in Mexican cemeteries as well as conceptual altar designs inspired by this joyful celebration.

## Altar Exhibition

Dia de los Muertos -- which falls on the Catholic All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day, the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> of November -- brings together family and friends to remember those who have passed away. Mexican traditions include building altars in homes and on gravesites and using many traditional items such as candles, flowers, the deceased's favorite foods and drinks, photographs, and other items specific to the individual, to create a colorful tribute.

**Altar Designs:** In the past, many artists have been inspired by traditional altars but opt to use their own themes, designs, and materials to honor or remember an individual or group.

We are inviting you to create either a traditional or conceptual altar at the Old Episcopal Burying Ground on the corner of 3<sup>rd</sup> St. and Elm Tree Lane.



## Details and Eligibility:

Artists may work as individuals, partners or may coordinate a group altar. A limited amount of financial assistance up to \$50 may be available depending on the LASC receiving the necessary support funding for individual artists who need help purchasing materials for the construction of their altar. Only one stipend will be paid per entry. **School groups and community groups are encouraged to participate but are ineligible for stipends.**



**How to Enter:** Please use the attached entry form to describe in 200 words or less your proposal for an altar, including the materials you will use and the estimated size of the piece. Proposals may include photographs and/or sketches. All visual media will be accepted and different cultural interpretations are encouraged.
